

## Missouri Industrial Resource Fact Sheet

### Introduction

Missouri's industrial manufacturing sector accounts for 13.3 percent of the state's gross domestic product (GDP), providing the state with 284,982 jobs. Missouri's leading industries include transportation equipment manufacturing, food manufacturing, and chemical manufacturing. Missouri's local industry used 433.7 trillion British thermal units (Btu), or 23.7 percent of all energy consumed in the state. Additionally, the industrial sector accounted for approximately 7.9 million metric tons of carbon dioxide in 2005.

Due to rising costs in energy, Missouri has realized the need to encourage investments in energy efficiency. In an effort to promote energy efficiency and renewable energy, the state government passed legislation. In 2007, Governor Matt Blunt signed the *Green Power Initiative*, which set targets for utility companies to use renewable-energy sources, starting with 4 percent in 2012 and increasing to 11 percent by 2020. In 2009, the state's government passed SB 376, which encourages utilities to offer energy-efficiency programs to their customers. Additional resources that are available throughout the state are listed below.



### Government Resources

*State Government:* The Missouri Department of Natural Resources Energy Division offers a corporate and industrial tax credit for wood energy producers, in addition to providing resources on external energy-funding opportunities.

### Utility Resources

*Investor-Owned Utilities:* AmerenUE created its Business Energy Efficiency Programs to help Missouri's commercial and industrial businesses manage rising energy costs, promote in-state economic development, protect the environment, and control the state's growing demand for electricity. The utility offers cash incentives for installing energy-efficient measures and provides resources, such as benchmarking, energy calculators, a resource library, and facility assessments. In addition, Empire District Electric Company and Kansas City Power & Light offer energy audits and rebates to industrial customers for the installation of energy-efficient equipment.

*Public Power Utilities:* Chillicothe Municipal Utilities offers rebates on specific energy-efficient equipment. City Utilities of Springfield offers energy audits and rebates. Columbia Water and Light offers energy audits and rebates, in addition to a load-management program and a program that provides a free tree to help with energy efficiency.

*Electric Cooperatives:* Associated Electric Cooperative—a company that provides wholesale power to six regional and 51 local electric-cooperative systems in Missouri, northeast Oklahoma, and southeast Iowa—offers commercial and industrial energy audits. In addition to the energy audits, some of the Associated Electric Cooperatives offer a variety of energy rebates.

### Local Resources

*Industrial Assessment Center (IAC):* The University of Missouri-Columbia Industrial Assessment Center (IAC), with funding from the U.S. Department of Energy, offers programs to help industrial manufacturers improve their cost and energy savings. The Missouri IAC also offers free energy audits to small- and medium-sized manufacturing facilities.
