Proposed Action or Project Description:

American Recovery and Reinvestment Act:

1) Develop Energy Efficiency and Conservation Strategy (completed), 2) develop city-wide energy management plan – study development only, 3) develop a “Waste to Energy (Cogeneration) Plan” – study development only, 4) develop LEED policies and practices for all new and major re-construction of municipal buildings, 5) develop and implement a “Municipal Energy Efficiency Lighting and Renewable Energy Projects” which includes upgrades to interior/exterior lighting 6) develop a “Renewable Energy Feasibility Study” for supplying electricity to city facilities – study development only, 7) install vehicle charging station at Kirkwood Community College Hotel, and 8) conduct interior lighting retrofits at Cedar Rapids Water Pollution Control Facility (Operations, Maintenance, Administration, and Incinerator Buildings).

Conditions: None--Programmatic Agreement covers activities associated with facilities >50 yrs
