1) Develop an energy sustainability action plan/strategy (complete), 2) establish an energy auditing program for municipal and commercial facilities, 3) lighting upgrades at the Civic Center Complex (1964), 4) establish an Energy Office which includes community outreach to residences and businesses to improve energy efficiency, 5) develop a non-motorized transportation plan, 6) building/lighting retrofits to the Beechwood Arena (1974) and HVAC upgrades, 7) technical consultant services to assist with energy efficiency retrofits, and 8) exterior lighting upgrades at the Civic Center Complex.
