- **The Energy Program Loans** -- Iowa has a Revolving Loan Fund to provide energy efficiency loans to homeowners. Iowa also has a Loan Loss Reserve pool to make financing through private sector lending institutions possible for industrial, agricultural, and commercial sector entities that wish to improve their energy efficiency. In conjunction with the Iowa Energy Bank Program, Iowa also has an ARRA SEP-funded Revolving Loan Fund for public sector entities that wish to borrow from state's program instead of through a private lending institution. - **The Iowa Power Fund Program** -- This program provides financial incentives to stimulate the research and development of energy technologies in Iowa. The program provides grants or loans to late-stage research and early stage commercialization. In addition, a Communities Grant Program provides grants to communities to develop energy plans and increase public awareness of energy efficiency benefits as well renewable energy resources.
