**Q: Does a third party testing laboratory have to be certified to test external power supplies?**

**A: DOE does not have** any lab certification requirements regarding external power supply testing at this time. DOE allows the manufacturer to use its discretion in choosing a lab (e.g. an in-house manufacturer lab versus a third party lab) as long as testing is done in accordance with DOE's test procedure for external power supplies.
