Timeline

- Start: October 1, 2020
- End: December 31, 2023
- 70% complete

Barriers Addressed

- Public with limited or no access to a garage and/or who cannot afford to purchase an EV
- Lack of public charging infrastructure

Targets

- 70 Community Hubs (280 L2 + 10 DCFC)
- 200 Shared electric vehicles
- 25 Multi-unit dwellings with EVSE & EV

Project Approach









Budget Period 1

Project Initiation and Launch

- Reviewed locations for community charging hubs/began installation
- Bid and awarded electric vehicle supply equipment company (ZEF Energy)
- Reviewed vehicles options for carshare program (ordered 101 Chevrolet Bolt)
- Developed multi-unit dwellings program and matrix
- Initiate outreach and promotional activities (built website, developed logo, introduction of project at community events)

Budget Period 2 (2022) Implementation, Deployment & Education

- Continue location assessment for community charging hubs and continue installation
- Reviewed vehicles options for 2nd vehicle carshare purchase (ordered 50 Nissan LEAF and LEAF Plus)
- Continue site visits multi-unit dwellings program
- · Collect data and disseminate lessons to other regions.
- Continue outreach and promotional activities (Public launch event May 2022, public launch of multifamily sites, host ride & drives, partner with local festivals with carshare program

Budget Period 3 (2023) Final Completion

- Commission final sites for community charging hubs (70 sites: All have level 2, 10 fast charging)
- Receive and implement final order vehicles into carshare program & multifamily carshare program
- Continue site visits multi-unit dwellings program and implementation and activation (25 sites)













Project is slated to close in FY23 therefore no FY24 milestone to share. Pl will request a 6 month no-cost continuation to complete implementation of Multi-unit dwelling portion of project. Equipment and supply chain issues, timeline of authorization of carshare with property owners along with Minnesota winter construction season caused a variety of delays.





Challenges:

- Availability of EVs for fleet | Chevy Bolt Recall
- Global Supply Chain challenges
- Vehicle Damage | Electric charging equipment failures

Sustainability:

- Proposed Eastside Expansion as shown on slide #6
- Wide variety of funding partners will make project sustainable beyond the period of performance.
- Media support and presentations continues to grow carshare territory and multi-unit dwelling support and interest.
- Key messaging, best practices and speaking opportunities will continue to be developed and shared with partners outside of region.
- Website revamp while keeping Community Engagement Report and other documents for national show.

Summary









Approach

- Create the basis for a highly visible, sustainable electric vehicle (EV) ecosystem in Saint Paul,
 Minneapolis, and the surrounding seven-county metropolitan area.
- Make the benefits of EV technology broadly available in the Twin Cities region, especially in underserved areas.

Collaborations

Local governments, Community Based Organizations, Utilities, Private and Non-Profit Companies

Accomplishments

- 46 of 70 charging hubs port level 2 EVSE have been installed and commissioned
- 10 DC Fast Charging locations have been confirmed and equipment right sized and ordered
- 150 have been deployed as a one-way carsharing network
- 21 of 50 vehicles for use by residents at the multi-unit dwellings have been secured
- 1 of 10 ride and drive events have been completed (2022 included dozens of events)
